# Seek Financial Support

Pupil Premium Grant (PPG): Schools receive funding to support students from low-income families. While parents can't apply directly, it's worth asking your school if they can provide assistance, such as vouchers for uniform purchases.

School uniform grants: Some councils offer grants or vouchers to help with uniform costs. If you receive a means-tested benefit, you might qualify for additional support like Free School Meals, which could also come with uniform assistance.

Local charities: The Blue Coat Foundation in Ipswich is one example of a charity that supports families with school uniform costs, particularly for secondary school children. Referrals are made through council agencies.

Local community projects such as school uniform banks, or pop-up shops offer uniforms at low or no cost. These resources are often available through schools, local councils, or community centres.
